



S.O.S. Save Our Shade!

Sunset Hills Is Losing Too Many Mature Trees Each Year!

hese valuable trees do more for our neighborhood than add charm and value

to our homes, they are able to cool the surrounding landscape by 10+ degrees in summer and offer safe habitat & nourishment to a large variety of wildlife.

English Ivy (Hedera helix) can cover a 50 foot Oak tree in a few years, cutting off sunlight, nutrients and eventually killing the tree.

Thankfully there are Free & Easy steps Homeowners can take to SAVE OUR SHADE.

Arborists suggest using hand pruners, loppers, and gloves to work at waist height removing the leaves to get a good look at the Ivy's vines.

Use pruners or loppers to cut the vines around the entire circumference of the tree. This will separate the Ivy from their source of nutrients. Pull the cut vines down to



For vines thicker than 1'' - a pruning saw is helpful but be careful not to cut into the tree bark.

Arborists prefer laying a 2-inch layer of thick leaf or chip mulch 3 feet around the tree. Be sure to keep the mulch 3 inches away from the trunk to insure air exchange.

I thought I would introduce you to my 501c3 Nonprofit, Triad Musicians Matter, that I formed in 2011 to help professional musicians from the Triad financially in the event that their ability to gig and earn money through their craft was affected by sudden illness, hospitalization, accident, death, or displacement from home due to fire or natural disasters. We refugee resettlement, I realize how important and supportive Greensboro is and has been in the past. I've very proud of that. Knowing how important music has been to me and other musicians, I founded The Guitar **Resettlement Project through** which we gift donated guitars to refugees who are resettling in the Triad. All donators get a tax receipt for their donated guitar, a few which have come from Sunset Hills by the way. They are restrung, tuned and minor repairs are made if necessary.

Sunset Hills History Project News

irst of all, a big Thank You to everyone who has participated in the project so far!

Second, here are the updates on the 2 components:

1. In conjunction with our Centennial Celebration, we have begun collecting documents related to the homes that make up our Sunset Hills neighborhood. With the cooperation of UNCG, we will be developing a website to house and organize the documents in a searchable format. Several people have provided documents and photographs.

2. We are also doing videotaped interviews with some of our neighbors who have lived in their SH homes for a long time, and the UNCG team has agreed to post these videos on the website as well. So far we have identified 2 residents who have been in their homes for over 70 years!!, and several more in the 60+, 50+ and 40+ categories. I have completed 9 of the interviews and have sent these in to be loaded on the website. I hope to do another 6 or 7 to get us to at least 15.

One person declined to be included, which is fine, but the others have been absolutely wonderful, with great stories to tell and lots of history. One neighbor remembered Fritz Klenner walking by her house regularly, and remembered seeing a UFO that was also seen by others in the neighborhood. Several told about some unusual features of their homes and how they came to be there, such as 2 front doors and 2 addresses for the same house!

This has been great fun and has given me an even stronger appreciation for our special neighborhood. During the interviews, I have asked each person for a piece of advice to pass along to younger and newer SH residents – almost every one has mentioned the importance of getting to know your neighbors.

There is still time to submit names for people to be included in the videotaping, or to submit documents for scanning. Please call me with any questions or suggested names!

Park Happenings

e are all fortunate to live in Sunset Hills, and we are all very fortunate to enjoy our wonderful park!

Sunset Hills Environmental Affairs (SHEA) and the Sunset Hills Garden Club (SHGC) as Adopt a Park, in conjunction with City Parks and Rec, have worked hard over the years to ensure the park has been maintained.

SHEA spearheaded the removal of invasive plants such as English Ivy, Privet, Tree of Heaven, and Mimosa trees. Poison Ivy, although a beneficial native, was also removed to make the park more enjoyable for people and their dogs. This was an enormous undertaking, and we all can see the benefit this spring- the park has never looked lovelier. SHEA

adopted the stream and conducts stream cleans in the spring and fall that include a full reporting of the items cleared from the stream. SHEA also installed the kiosks with bulletin boards and environmental lending libraries. SHGC replants and maintains the corners and signs, maintains the bluebird houses and the Little Free Library on Friendly, sponsors neighborhood initia-

tives such as the daffodils, and is in contact with the city for maintenance, such as adding mulch to

storms and park clean ups.

The park has come a long way,

but we need everyone's help to let it reach its full potential! You have no doubt already noticed "leave the leaves" signs. This practice cuts down on noxious weeds and improves the health of our soil. In the past, we have had the city out

after big storms or park clean ups to remove the debris. Now, to help

maintain a healthy park, the plan is to just pull the debris out of walking pathways and

let it be. According to the NC State Extension Office "Decaying logs attract insects, fungi, lichen, and moss, providing a food source for wildlife. As logs decay, they replenish soil nutrients and act as 'nurse logs' for new tree seedlings to sprout. Over 20 bird species, over 50 mammal species, and many species of reptiles and amphibians use downed logs in the southeastern U.S." To be clear, the goal is not to allow debris to pile up in an unsightly manner, or into big piles

which would invite the kind of mammal none of us want in our backyard - but rather let the park be a park. When you see a fallen branch, instead of drag-



ging it to the curb for pick up, please place it in a safe, out of the way place. Please feel free to help break up some of the branches into small pieces as you walk.

Another concern that we would like to remedy is the mowing down of canopy seedlings. Every two weeks we routinely destroy any chance of the natural regeneration of healthy canopy trees by mowing the entire park. In an attempt to let canopy seedlings grow to the point where we can recognize

them, then protect them, we have set aside three "No Mow Zones." The zones will not be "no mow" forever, there will be wide mowed pathways, the edge by the street will be mowed, and all of it (except



While the project to rid the park of invasives was a success, we still have random spots where stubborn invasives such as English Ivy, Sweet Autumn Clematis, Japanese Honeysuckle, and Mimosa trees have come back. SHEA and the Sunset Hills Board are looking into hiring the company who did the initial project to return one day this summer. Signs will be posted, and flower beds, including the daffodils, will not be treated. And don't forget that we are trying to reestablish canopy trees throughout Sunset Hills as part of our Centennial Celebration. The goal

is 100 new trees this year, and we

the seedlings!) will be mowed occasionally so that it will not get too tall. are halfway there! SHGC has committed to 10 new Dogwood trees in the park, in addition to the ones already planted in coordination with Greensboro Beautiful this past fall. Be on the lookout for the SHEA forms for your new trees in the September newsletter.

Both SHGC as Adopt a Park and SHEA have been working hard to make our park better for us all. We hope you love and enjoy the park as much as we do, and will join with us in keeping the momentum going!

I have been updating my neighbors periodically on my progress.

Thanks to the generosity and

support I have received from the community, I was able to travel to Cardiff, Wales in January to represent Team USA



in a Parafencing World Cup. I was the youngest parafencer there and I was honored to meet and compete with top parafencers from around the world. I worked hard and I did well enough to be chosen to compete in the final team foil event. It was an awesome experience and I learned a lot.

In February, I competed in a Parafencing North American Cup in Charlotte, NC. This time, I defeated a

foil and I also received silver medals in epee and sabre. I was invited to another camp at the Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs


in March to train


